- Dance to jigs and reels--music you are familiar with and then treat your ears to the beautiful strains of the strathespey, a type of dance tune special to SCD.
- The emphasis will not be on elegant footwork but rather on having fun while gaining new dance skills and enjoying both what is familiar and what is new to you.
